The CPO stops child abuse by empowering adults and children with knowledge; responding to concerns of child maltreatment in the US and Canada; and helping management implement safety policies.

We train and support Child Protection Volunteers serving their local community; and assist the International Child Protection Office.

### POLICIES FOR CHILD SAFETY AT YOUR TEMPLE

- Children always supervised by a designated adult while at the temple.
- Children only allowed in temple ashrams with a parent/guardian.
- Maintain screening procedures for staff, volunteers, and residents.
- All staff/volunteers who have contact with children should receive annual child abuse awareness training, and know temple/ISKCON policies.
- Reduce risk by enhancing physical transparency in rooms where children and adults interact: glass panel doors, open doors, etc.



## **TYPES OF CHILD ABUSE**

- **Neglect:** Failure to provide for a child's basic needs including physical, educational, and emotional.
- **Physical abuse:** Non-accidental physical injury caused by a parent or caregiver, including hitting, kicking, shaking, burning, or harming a child.
- **Sexual abuse:** When a child is coerced, persuaded, seduced, or entrapped verbally or physically into sexual acts with an adult or an older or more powerful youth.
- Emotional/psychological abuse: Any pattern of behavior that impairs a

child's emotional development or sense of self-worth; conveying to the child that they are worthless, flawed, unwanted, unloved, or only of value to meet another person's needs.

## FACTS TO KNOW

- Child abuse occurs in every culture, class, and religion.
- The abuser is likely to be a trusted person in the child's life.
- Children need adults who know what to look for and what to do.
